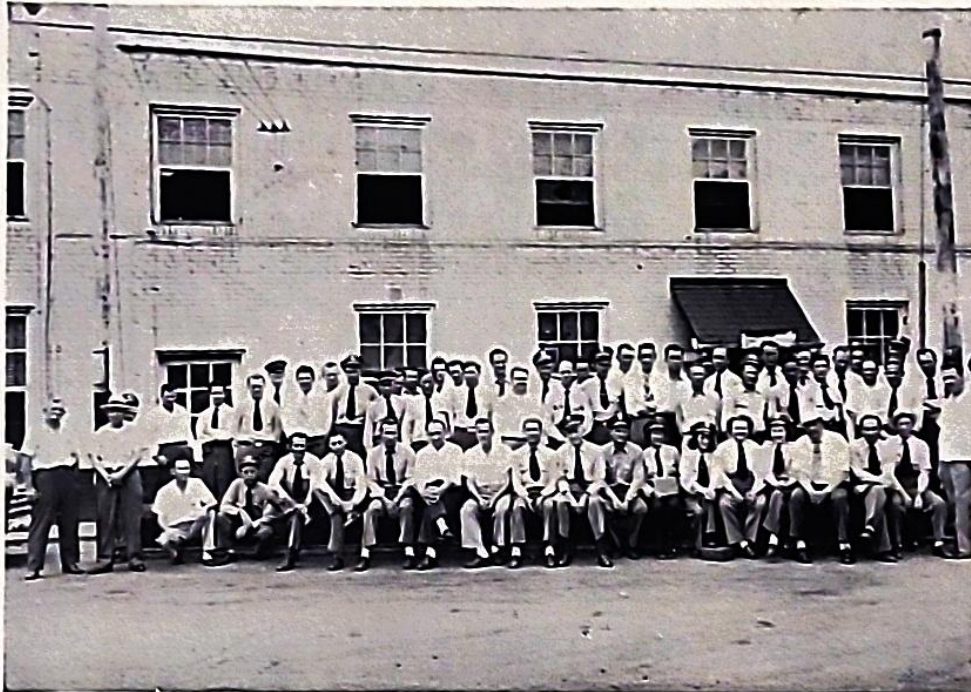

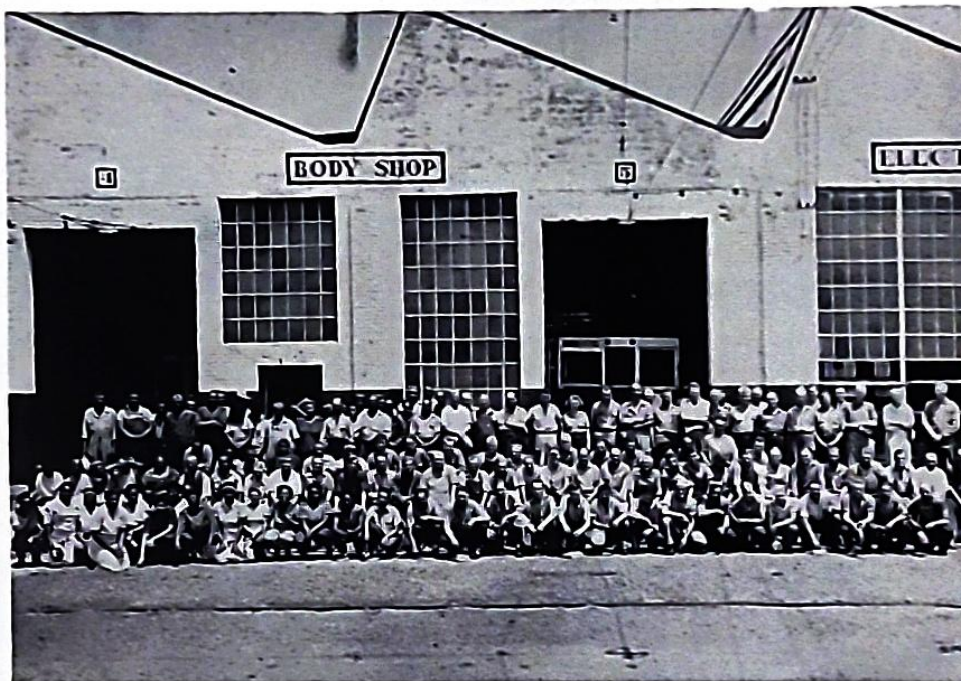

Stake of Labor In Mobilization Is Freedom

This Labor Day, when the nation honors its mighty host of working men and women, provides a welcome opportunity for me to voice gratification over the efforts of our working men and women in the mobilization program.

No one appreciates better than I how much the efforts of this force are adding to the sum total of our growing might. Without the skills and toil of labor we would not have in time the guns, tanks, planes and ships to discourage aggression by predatory powers—aggression which could very readily come to our own shores.

Need I prod the imagination as to what a military defeat of this nation by Communist hordes would entail for all of us? We have known liberty and freedom; we would never know them again.

Labor especially has a vital stake in the mobilization of our nation against the threat of war. That stake, of course, is the survival of labor as a free institution in a free world. In this country labor is an independent entity which can direct its own destiny.

Under totalitarianism labor would be reduced to a serfdom that would outrage all sense of human dignity. We know what happened to labor under the dictatorial regimes of Hitler and Mussolini. And we are aware that in Soviet Russia a major factor in the life of working people is compulsion by the state. This does not comport with our traditional idea of a working man's innate right to sell his services whenever, wherever, and to whomever he wishes.

In mobilizing our nation's resources for preparedness, manpower is a key consideration. In terms of numbers alone, we cannot match the inexhaustible hosts of our potential enemy. We

Their philosophy links the union with life as well as work and union discipline has enabled them to fashion the tools by which they may day by day contribute more to society and have for themselves access to opportunities.

Labor Entitled to Protection from Exorbitant Prices

The members of organized labor may well congratulate themselves on the vision of their leadership in supporting strong economic controls in the present national emergency. It speaks well for the rank and file of American labor that they have given their leaders full cooperation in the stand for stabilization of our economy.

Never for a moment have I questioned the ability of free American labor to out-produce the slave labor of Communism. Given the tools, the materials and the incentives, American workers can again rearm America and her allies, as they did in World War II, and at the same time supply the home front with the essentials of a sound domestic economy.

But during the time when America labor has cooperatively recognized the need for some emergency limitations that affect free collective bargaining as to wages, labor is entitled to protection from exorbitant prices and rents. All segments of our society on fixed incomes are entitled to the same protection.

All of our people are entitled to protection of the buying power of the American dollar, and the benefits of such restrictions on prices and rents as will make the dollar they spend equal in value to the dollar they earn.

That is the position of the Economic Stabilization Agency. In sustaining this position, we welcome the cooperation of organized labor and of every worker, as we welcome the support of all other groups working to maintain a sound economy during this period of defense mobilization.

**First Consideration Must Be
Given To Our Security**

On this Labor Day, the 8 million members of the American Federation of Labor would do well to take stock of the status of our trade union movement in the community, in the nation and in the world.

Our first consideration must be given to security—the security of peace, the security of our precious freedom, and the security of our standards of work and living.

Events have proved beyond question that the only serious threat to world peace stems from the Kremlin. Because of Soviet Russia's aggressive imperialism, we were forced to intervene as the agent of the United Nations to defend Korea. Because of the Communists' far-flung preparations for further aggressions against peaceful nations of Europe and Asia, we were compelled to initiate a vast national defense program supplemented by military and economic assistance to our allies.

As we take inventory of these basic policies and programs, we are justified by the results in reaching the conclusion that America followed a wise and courageous course. Labor should be proud of the fact that it consistently supported firm resistance against

Soviet aggression and full collaboration with the free nations of the world.

Moreover, from the beginning, the American Federation of Labor has backed up the defense program to the hilt, uncomplainingly accepting major sacrifices and emergency control over wages.

Our one demand has been for equality of sacrifice in the defense program. We appealed to the government and we appealed to Congress for action to stabilize the cost of living so that the nation's workers could undergo wage stabilization without serious impairment of living standards.

Our request for representation on key defense agencies was complied with by the government.

But Congress turned us down. The same coalition of Dixiecrats and reactionary Republicans that was responsible for the enactment of the reprehensible Taft-Hartley Act teamed up against us again. It rejected our appeal for strengthening of price control and opened the door for higher prices and still higher profits at the behest of Big Business interests.

And so, as we take stock, we come to the inevitable conclusion that unless we expand and perfect our political activities organized labor stands to lose through hostile legislation much of the ground that it has gained over the years through organization, struggle and collective bargaining.

The big job ahead of us is to shatter the grip which the stand-pat coalitionists hold over Congress. We must elect a liberal Congress in 1952 in order to safeguard the interests of the nation's workers and consumers.

In view of the grave problems confronting our modern world, every American citizen must do his or her part in preserving peace, freedom and economic progress. More than ever before, political action is the key toward the achievement of those goals. We must have a government and a Congress responsive to the needs of the people and alert to the dangers besetting the free world. We can have such a government and such a Congress if every qualified citizen makes certain to vote.

Therefore, labor will redouble its efforts to get out the vote in the 1952 campaign.

During the past year, labor at the local, national and international level reached new heights of influence, prestige and constructive leadership. In the year ahead, if peace can be made secure, we hope to make further gains in our constant effort to lift the standards of life not only for our own members but for human beings throughout the world.
